8. Music Scholarship Process:

Suitable Music Scholarship candidates will be invited to an audition and a music theory assessment.

Audition requirements:

- Three pieces of contrasting styles will need to be played to the selection panel.
- Three copies of the relevant music must be provided for the members of the panel.
- Should the applicant audition on more than one instrument, one piece must be played on the second instrument.
- The candidate will be tested on scales and sight reading at the level of the pieces played.
- The candidate will be required to undergo an **aural test**.
- The candidate will undergo a **theory assessment**.
- The candidate will undergo a short **interview** with the panel.
- Where required, the candidate should provide her own accompanist.

9. Drama Scholarship Process:

Suitable Musical Theatre/Drama Scholarship candidates will be invited to an audition.

Audition requirements (3 items as follows):

- **Item 1:** Solo Dramatic Extract/Monologue of the candidate's own choice (3 to 5 minutes long).
 - The candidate should play one character only. A brief introduction must be given.
 - The extract may be taken from any play or from prose adapted into a script. Extracts must be memorised.
 - Costume, make-up, props and music may not be used.
 - A copy of the script is to be provided to the panel.
- **Item 2:** Solo Dramatised Prose (3 to 5 minutes long).
 - The candidate should play a range (3-5) characters. A brief introduction must be given.
 - The extract may be taken from any source of prose e.g. a Myth, novel, folktale. Extracts must be memorised.
 - Costume, make-up, props and music may not be used.
 - A copy of the text is to be provided to the panel.
- **Item 3:** Poem (minimum of 14 lines e.g. a sonnet) OR Musical Theatre.

For the poem:

- The poem must be memorised.
- The candidate may include movement where applicable and appropriate.
- A copy of the poem is to be provided to the panel.

OR,

For the Musical Theatre item:

- The candidate should sing an item of their own choice, from a published musical, that suits their vocal range.
- If a backing track is used, the candidate is required to bring her own sound system and device for playing the track.
- Sheet music is to be provided to the panel.

10. Scholarship Obligations:

Music Scholarship students are obliged:

- To play an active role in the music life of the school (membership of choirs and/or ensembles).
- To take the Music Pathway in the Grades 8 & 9 Arts and Culture offer.
- To take Music as an FET subject from Grades 10 to 12.
- To attend all music functions and concerts.
- To maintain a high academic standard.

Drama Scholarship students are obliged:

- To play an active role in the cultural life of the school.
- To take the Drama Pathway in the Grades 8 & 9 Arts and Culture offer.
- To take Dramatic Arts as an FET subject from Grades 10 to 12.
- To maintain a high academic standard.

11. Exclusions:

- Instrument, ballet or private performing arts tuition fees.
- Fees for Eisteddfodau, external examinations and competitions.
- Instrument hire, if applicable.
- Cost of tours.
