Music Scholarship & Bursary Process:

Suitable music scholarship/bursary candidates will be invited to an audition and music theory assessment.

Audition requirements:

- Three pieces of contrasting styles will need to be played to the selection panel.
- Three copies of the relevant music must be provided for the members of the panel.
- Should the applicant audition on more than one instrument, one piece must be played on the second instrument.
- The candidate will be tested on scales and sight reading at the level of the pieces played.
- The candidate will be required to complete an aural test.
- The candidate will complete a theory assessment.
- The candidate will be interviewed by the panel.
- Where required, the candidate should provide her own accompanist.

Scholarship & Bursary Benefits:

- The scholarship or bursary provides a disbursement on academic tuition fees.
- The enrolment fee is aligned with the percentage disbursement offered in the scholarship or bursary.
- Uniforms, books, stationery, electronic devices, study requirements, extras, and levies are <u>excluded</u> from the disbursement.
- The full instrument tuition fee is payable.
- Fees for Eisteddfodau, external examinations and competitions are excluded.
- Instrument hire, if applicable, is excluded.

Annual Renewal

The intention of the school is to provide a scholarship or bursary for the full five years of High School. Scholarships and bursaries are reviewed annually, and there is no automatic renewal of a scholarship/bursary. Should a student not continue to meet the requirements for scholarship/bursary, the scholarship/bursary may be reassigned.

Conduct and Attitude

It is expected that scholarship or bursary recipients will have a positive attitude, be of good conduct and show loyalty to their school. Continued misdemeanors or gross violations of the school's Code of Conduct will place the scholarship/bursary in jeopardy, and a decision to withdraw the scholarship/bursary will be at the sole discretion of the school.

Cancellation of Scholarship/Bursary

Should the scholarship or bursary recipient leave the school before the five years of High School have been completed, for any reason not mutually agreed upon, the parent/guardian will be liable to repay the school the value of the scholarship/bursary for the time that the student was at the school.
